## Profile

The Foundation for the People of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Springfield in Illinois is a not-

**for-profit corporation** of the state of Illinois, legally separate from the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois. It was incorporated on October 14, 1992. Its purposes are to further the ministries of and to receive funds for the religious, charitable, educational and social purposes of the diocese within the meaning of section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

In practice, the Foundation manages **endowed monies** on behalf of parishes, parish schools, diocesan entities and purposes.

The members of the **Board of Directors** of the Foundation are diocesan officials: the diocesan bishop (president), the vicar general/moderator of the curia (vice-president), the diocesan finance officer (treasurer), the director of the Office for Stewardship and Development (secretary) and the Superintendent of Catholic Schools.

The bylaws of the Foundation require that the president of the Board of Directors appoint an advisory board to offer advice on any matter handled by the Foundation. Each member of the advisory board serves for a three-year term, which is renewable. It is required to meet annually, though in practice it meets more frequently.

# Criteria, Policies and Guidelines

Following are the criteria and guidelines governing participation in the Foundation:

- $\overline{\mathbf{M}}$ Any diocesan entity may establish an endowment in the Foundation for the People of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Springfield in Illinois with a contribution of \$1,000 or more.
- $\overline{\mathbf{V}}$ Donors may add any amount to an existing endowment within the Foundation at any time throughout the year.
- $\overline{\mathbf{V}}$ The beneficiaries of the Foundation shall be the parishes and parish schools of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Springfield in Illinois and those diocesan entities or purposes specifically designated as the beneficiaries of the Foundation by the diocesan bishop (e.g., the formation of seminarians, the continued formation of priests, the health care of priests, the pensions of priests, etc.).
- The "representatives" for any execution of forms or for any decisions to be made by beneficiaries shall be the pastors (or their equivalents in canon law) of the parishes and parish schools which are beneficiaries, and the diocesan bishop of the diocesan entities and purposes which are beneficiaries.
- $\overline{\mathbf{V}}$ Each beneficiary shall have a local advisory board whose bylaws are approved by the Board of Directors. This advisory board will advise the representatives of the beneficiary on the disbursement of

earnings. Parishes may choose to select an existing group to

fulfill this role.

- $\overline{\mathbf{Q}}$ Distributions from the Foundation are made annually. Beneficiaries have the option of taking full payment of any earnings, reinvesting those earnings, placing those funds in a deferred account for later disbursal or any combination of the above.
- $\overline{\mathbf{V}}$ The Foundation is audited once a year in accordance with standard accounting practices.

## Teaching the Faith in our Parishes

Passing on the Faith is one of the primary missions of our parishes. To ensure the quality of that teaching we need to have well trained catechists and solid adult formation programs. Many parishes would like to enhance their catechetical programs but lack the resources. In 2003, Bishop Lucas saw an opportunity to help our parishes fund these improvements by including this need in the Harvest of Thanks, Springtime of Hope campaign. Included in the case statement was an endowment for catechist formation and religious education. This \$1.25 million endowment was to be used for:

- Assisting in the professional training of catechetical leadership personnel (DRE's and CRE's)
- Support catechists in attaining or advancing certification in the Diocesan Catechist Certification process
- Supply media and catechetical/adult enrichment materials
- Enrich programs for adult faith formation

The number of awards varies from year to year, but on average, 20 grants are made to parishes. What sorts of things do these grants fund? In some parishes they have been used by catechists to get advanced training, while in others they have helped acquire audiovisual equipment or books/materials for a particular program. All have one thing in common, they have helped our parishes enhance their catechetical programs. Grant applications are very simple and are available through the Office for Catechesis. #### **Giving During Your Lifetime**

Outright gifts of cash and/or securities are welcomed by the Foundation. Donors who make gifts during their lifetime also enjoy the benefit of witnessing the immediate results of their generosity.

#### Giving In The Future

Many gifts to the Foundation can be made through legacy arrangements

**Bequests** may be cash or property. Provisions for gifts to the Foundation from an estate may be for a specified amount or a percentage of the remainder after all other bequests and obligations have been satisfied.

**Life insurance** gifts can be made naming the Foundation for the People of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Springfield in Illinois as beneficiary.

**Retirement plans** are valuable gifts to consider. By naming the Foundation as beneficiary of these assets, one can avoid taxation and possibly pass on larger estates to loved ones.

#### How to Establish a Fund With The Foundation

The funds are invested and generate ongoing revenue for the parishes, schools, programs and organizations of the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois. Donors may name endowments in memory of or in honor of their family, friends or loved ones. Anonymity is also available.
